**POSITIONS FOR DISABLED MEN**

WASHINGTON, D. C., May 17.—Through the service and information branch of the general staff, it is announced that there are several thousand civil positions under the war department now open for discharged soldiers partially disabled from wounds or diseases incurred in the war.

For some months past Secretary of War Baker, acting in conjunction with the federal board for vocational training and the civil service commission, has been working on a plan whereby the war department might provide for the partially disabled soldiers under its own jurisdiction. This plan has now been worked out, and is fully described in bulletin No. 12, just published.

Congress has already provided that in making appointments to clerical and other positions in the executive branch of the government preference shall be given to honorably discharged veterans and their widows or wives. This statute does not exempt applicants from the usual examinations under the civil service, but they will be required to attain an average percentage of only 65 in order to become eligible for appointment, while others must make at least 70.

Age limitations are also waived for veterans; they will be released from all height and weight requirements, except for the positions of guard and watchman; they will be certified for appointment in the war department at 2 Washington without regard to the apportionment of appointments among the states and territories; and after passing the necessary examination, they will have their names placed on a register ahead of those not entitled to preference.

Quoting from the new bulletin: "The war department, the federal board for vocational education, and the civil service commission will cooperate to facilitate in every way possible the employment under the war department in the District of Columbia and elsewhere, of partially disabled soldiers on an equal basis with those who have not sustained physical injury.

"To become eligible for permanent appointment the partially disabled soldier must qualify through the usual examination in the same manner that is required of other persons seeking employment in the classified civil service. Having so qualified, he is entitled to the preference in appointment."

The following defects will not bar veterans from examination, but may prevent appointment to a particular position: Paralysis or epilepsy, not serious in degree; loss of both arms or both legs; loss of arm and leg; badly crippled or deformed hands, arms, feet or legs; locomotor ataxia; cancer; Bright's disease; diabetes; defective hearing.

Where physical examinations are necessary, army surgeons when practicable will make them without charge.

Some of the positions under the war department in which partially disabled soldiers may be employed are those of stenographer, typist, clerk, file clerk, messenger, watchman, multigraph operator, mimeograph operator, blue printer, skilled laborer, foreman of laborers, packer, sign painter, electrician, carpenter, painter, checker, elevator operator, storekeeper, timekeeper, and the like.

Information as to the positions and their locations may be obtained from any office of the war department, the civil service commission, or the federal board for vocational education. Application blanks may be had from any district secretary of the civil service commission. They have their offices in the post office or custom house in each city in the United States that has free delivery mail; or full particulars and blanks may be had by writing direct to the United States civil service commission, Washington, D. C.
