VOTE SECURED TO ALLIED SOLDIER

WHEELING, W. Va., May 25.—The right of an American to vote has not been forfeited if he has sworn allegiance to a foreign allied nation to aid in the prosecution of war, according to a recent ruling of Attorney General E. T. England, of West Virginia.

The ruling was made in the case of Albert Marshall, of Wheeling, who had been denied the right to vote because he enlisted with Canadian troops at the beginning of the world war. However, he joined the American army when the first of the expeditionary forces arrived overseas.
