### MEXICAN SUGAR COMING TO U. S.

SAN FRANCISCO, May 27.—The prevailing high price of sugar in the United States is attracting sugar in large quantities from western Mexico to San Francisco, according to Victor Patron, a former Mazatlan merchant now in business in San Francisco, who reports that several thousand bags have arrived here recently by steamer from the states of Sinaloa and Navarrit. This is the first time in several years that there has been sugar exported to California, Patron said. Sinaloa has four refineries, two of them owned by American interests, while the Navarrit refinery is controlled by Spanish capital, he said.

Unfavorable weather conditions cut down an expected yield of 1,000,000 boxes of tomatoes in Sinaloa to quarter that amount, according to Patron, but the tomato crop is still so much larger than that of last year that considerable exportation to the United States is expected this year, he said.

At the beginning of the war aeroplanes had a maximum speed of 85 to 90 miles an hour, and were capable of climbing to a height of 10,000 feet. At the end the greatest speed was over 130 miles an hour, and greatest height reached was over 25,000 feet.

## TACOMA HOLDS OWN IN FLOWER

TACOMA, Wash., May 28.—Tacoma, fifth city in the United States in the manufacture of flour, has more than held its own in shipping facilities following the shifting conditions brought about by the ending of the war. Alteration of trade routes to the present time have not brought back several foreign shipping lines formerly operating out of Tacoma, but the advent of new American steamship lines have more than made up for this foreign loss. However, in this connection the old lines give promise of an early resumption of service which will give added outlets for the exports of Tacoma to Europe and oriental ports.

Unlike some of the coast cities which obtained much of their activity during the war through a boom brought by military necessity and then discovered a cessation of work upon the signing of the armistice, this condition did not affect Tacoma. Tacoma had four large wooden ship yards in operation during the war. These are now closed, but the one big steel yard which commenced operations at that time still has government contracts on hand and combined with naval construction will be in certain operation for at least two years. It employs 5,000 men.

At the present time this port is connected to the Orient by the Pacific Steamship line; the Garland; the Struthers and Dixon, and A. M. Gillespie and company, while Japanese lines in the trade out of here are the Osaka Shosen Kaisha, the terminus being Tacoma; the Nippon Yusen Kaisha, the Mitsui lines and other vessels engaged in a tramp service. The Grace, General Steamship company and the Campagne De Boleo give Tacoma a direct service to ports of Mexico, Peru and Chile on the west coast of South America while the new line inaugurated by Swayne and Hoyt will reach to the River Platte on the east coast via the Straits of Magellan. The Islands of the Pacific are reached from Tacoma by the Matson line which gives a regular service to Honolulu, while the General Steamship company will go to Australian ports from Tacoma.

The Blue Funnel line and the Harrison line are planning a direct service from Tacoma to Europe. This service, formerly one of the features from Tacoma, was discontinued as the result of the war.

The service now from Tacoma by American vessels is about the same as that of Japanese lines where before the war the trade was handled entirely by Japanese or British bottoms. During the month of April this year four Japanese vessels took cargoes from Tacoma to the Orient and the same number of American ships sailed.

In connection with the foreign trade from Tacoma, conditions for new business is most optimistic, it is said. New port development here will give better cargo handling facilities. This is attracting old lines as well as new where the operators desire expeditious handling of cargo.

## WIRELESS ONLY LINK WITH OUTER WORLD

MILES CITY, Mont., May 28.—

Unconnected with the "outside world" by railroad or wires, Jordan, county seat of Garfield county, has solved the problem of speedy communication by the establishment of a wireless plant, operated under a schedule of rates approved by the Montana state utilities commission.

Messages now are handled between Jordan and this city, where the other station of the wireless circuit is located, on a commercial basis, and are relayed the remainder of the distance over land telegraph wires.

When the county of Garfield was carved out of the vast expanse of Custer county and Jordan was designated as the county seat, the only means of communication of the town was by a "star" mail route.

Not a line of railroad traverses the county.
