VERSAILLES, June 4.—The treaty of peace with Hungary was signed here this afternoon. The treaty with Hungary was the first of the treaties framed by the peace conference to be signed ahead of time.

WASHINGTON, June 4.—Without amendment the senate judiciary committee today reported out the house joint resolution providing for the repeal of all war legislation except the Lever food control bill and the trading with the enemy act.

WASHINGTON, June 4.—President Wilson today appointed a commission of three men to settle the wage controversy between the anthracite coal miners and operators. The commission's award is to be made within 60 days if possible. The wage award is to be retroactive to April 1.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 4.—A minimum wage system has been established for all women employed in agricultural occupations, including the picking of fruit, vegetables and berries, the state industrial welfare commission announced today.

VERA CRUZ, June 4.—Four new cases of bubonic plague were discovered today. Three of the victims were soldiers. Buildings on the municipal dock and nearby structures were burned in an effort to eliminate all possible centers of infection.

COLLECTING DUTY

BERLIN, May 14. (By Mail.)—"The hole in the West," the popular name for channels through the occupied territory through which articles of luxury poured into Germany evading the import duties, is now closed. The Inter-Allied Rhineland commission has agreed to enforce the new German ordinances imposing fines and imprisonment for infractions of the regulations on imports.
