## THIS IS TENTH CONVENTION FOR N. Y. WOMAN

NEW YORK, June 4.—Forty years ago Miss Helen Varick Boswell, lawyer and one of the pioneer women Republicans of the country, attended the Republican national convention with a chaperone. On June 3, Miss Boswell, who is vice chairman of the New York county Republican organization and well known as a humorous speaker, Mrs. Florence E. S. Knapp, of Syracuse, N. Y., and 20 alternates none of whom have chaperones, will attend the Republican national gathering in Chicago as the representatives of the women Republicans of New York state. They will go, they say, to participate in the proceedings "in the independent spirit which should characterize every voter."

"This is the tenth national Republican convention I have attended," declared Miss Boswell, "but it will be the first time I have ever occupied a place among the 'boys' on the convention floor. Women from all over the United States this time are going to be 'in' and not merely 'at' the convention. More than 25 of us are delegates and fully 75 are alternates."

Among the more prominent women delegates from other parts of the country will be Dr. Helen S. Peabody, of Sioux Falls, S. D., a delegate-at-large, well known as an educator and lawyer. Another delegate is Mrs. Katherine P. Edson, of Los Angeles, who was instrumental in having passed the California welfare laws protecting women and children. She has been a member of the state industrial commission of California and was the first chairman of the Republican women's state committees in California after women were enfranchised.

Mrs. John Glover South, delegate-at-large from Kentucky, is chairman of the woman's division of the Republican national committee. She is a cousin of Governor Morrow of Kentucky and a daughter of the late Frank O. Bradley, the first Republican governor Kentucky ever had. Kentucky in selecting Mrs. South as a delegate to the convention set the pace for other southern states to follow. Tennessee immediately elected a delegate-at-large and two women as alternates-at-large.

Mrs. Manley Fosson, of Minneapolis, has the honor of having been unanimously elected a delegate-at-large from Minnesota by the Republicans of that state. She is head of the women's Republican organization of Minnesota and has been actively engaged in combating the Non-Partisan league.

Mrs. Arthur L. Livermore, chairman of the Republican women's executive committee of New York, is an alternate-at-large from that state. She is the founder of the Women's University club of New York and is the daughter of Senator Henry Wells who was the treasurer of the Massachusetts Republican committee for a quarter of a century.

### CHINA TO EXPAND AERIAL SERVICE

SHANGHAI, May 3. (By Mail.)—General Ting Kinn, director of the Department of Aeronautics of the Chinese government, has outlined a big program of development in aeronautics in China.

"Within the next year," he asserted, "air mail routes will be established between Shanghai and Peking and between Peking and Urga and the machines that will supply this service will carry both freight and passengers."

The government of China last year contracted for the purchase of 100 airplanes from a British concern and 40 of these have been received. Others will be delivered through the summer.

General Ting said a large number of Chinese fliers are being trained at Peking and other Chinese airmen who have received training abroad will enter the service.

### MEDIUMS HAVE RUMANIA "GOING"

BUCHAREST, May 12. (By M. I.).—A wave of spiritualistic seances is sweeping over Rumania and some of the mediums claim to have received extraordinary "messages." One reported that an attempt to communicate with the spirit of Julius Caesar had failed because he was "commanding and governing in Mars and therefore out of reach."

### AUSTRIA RETURNS WAR RELIC TO SWEDEN

VIENNA, May 14. (By Mail.)—The general's collar worn by Gustavus Adolphus, King of Sweden, when he was killed at the battle of Lutzen in 1632, has been presented to the Scandinavian governments by the state in recognition of charity to Austria. The insignia was taken from his body by soldiers of the Austrian Guard and has been in the Military Museum here.

### WILL STEAM BOLL WORMS TO DEATH

NEW ORLEANS, June 4.—The pink boll worm, more destructive to cotton than the boll weevil, is to be steamed.

Poisoning has failed to kill the pest but it is expected that steaming will do the job and make it possible for oil mills to handle seed from infected territory.

The decision was the outcome of a conference here between superintendents of cotton-seed mills in Louisiana and other places where seed has been purchased from areas known to be infected with the worm.
