TEXAS COLLEGE HAS PRACTICAL COURSE

AUSTIN, Texas, June 5.—Young women students in the home economics department at the University of Texas are learning how to cut the cost of feeding a family. At the beginning the prime thing is to get a meal, but toward the finish of the course the young woman has also to turn out the finished product cheap.

The university expects its young experts to cut about half off the cost of a lunch by switching deserts and leaving off biscuits. Here is a sample of its before and after college menus:

For 45 cents a plate for four persons: Salmon croquettes, mashed potatoes, iced tea, tomato salad, biscuit, strawberries and ice cream.

For 24 cents a plate for four persons (toward the end of the course) creamed tuna fish on toast, French fried potatoes, apple and celery salad, hot tea, lemon pie.
