BRAZIL TO JOIN RELIEF MOVEMENT

RIO DE JANEIRO, May 8, (By Mall) .- The minister of agriculture has sent to the governors of the various states a circular letter requesting that they respond to the appeal of the people of the former central powers to the Brazilian people for food supplies. A commission for the relief of Germany and Austria has been organized in this city with representatives in all the states of Brazil.

The Correio da Manha calls attention to what it terms the humanitarian attitude of the United States in assisting the German and Austrian people without thought of race or politics, and adds:

"The philanthropic spirit of the North Americans has opened the way for the rest of free and generous America, and Brazil will take a leading part in this humanitarian work."
