**WILL RETURN GERMAN DESERTING VESSEL**

**THE HAGUE, May 11. (By Mail).**—The Dutch naval authorities have decided to return the German minesweeper UZ18, which was interned a few weeks ago, to the German minesweeping flotilla, from which it deserted. The vessel was taken by the German crew into the Zuldereze. At Muiden, a little fishing town, the

captain, mate and two other members of the crew went ashore in order to find a buyer for their boat, but were arrested. The rest of the crew, who were waiting in vain for their comrades, had grown impatient, were just going to leave the Dutch waters again, when they were caught by a Dutch torpedo-boat. **CALIFORNIA NEWS**

**WOODLAND, June 5.**—Fred Dieu-donne, physically disabled while fighting with the American forces in France during the late war, has received through the efforts of the home service department of the Yolo county chapter of the American Red Cross a check from the United States government for \$1573 in compensation for his disability.

**PLACERVILLE, June 5.**—Mrs. Kate Evans, one of the most widely known of the pioneers of this section, is dead at her home here after a short illness. She was 60 years of age, and died in the house where she was born and where she has made her home since birth.

**BENICIA, June 5.**—Fire discovered early last night destroyed the upper stories of the three frame buildings that compose the Anderson hotel and badly damaged the ground floors. The loss is estimated at \$35,000, on which there is an insurance of about \$10,000.

**WOODLAND, June 5.**—Harvesting of the Yolo county grain crop began here yesterday and is going ahead at a rapid rate. Haying crews are exceptionally busy in every quarter. The freaky weather of late wherein the north wind and accompanying hot spells worked against the harvesting of grain resulted in many farmers cutting their grain for hay only.

**YUBA CITY, June 5.**—The record price for peach orchard land was paid Tuesday, according to reports, for a 20-acre tract of Sutter county peach orchard sold to Ray Trask for Rosenberg Brothers by J. W. Steward for \$1850 an acre.

**BRAZIL TO JOIN RELIEF MOVEMENT**

**RIO DE JANEIRO, May 5. (By Mail).**—The minister of agriculture has sent to the governors of the various states a circular letter requesting that they respond to the appeal of the people of the former central powers to the Brazilian people for food supplies. A commission for the relief of Germany and Austria has been organized in this city with representatives in all the states of Brazil. The Correio da Manha calls attention to what it terms the humanitarian attitude of the United States in assisting the German and Austrian people without thought of race or politics, and adds: "The philanthropic spirit of the North Americans has opened the way for the rest of free and generous America, and Brazil will take a leading part in this humanitarian work."
