PLYMOUTH, Eng., May 15. (By Mail.)—Foundation stones of a new memorial to be called "The Mayflower Hall," which the Salvation Army proposes to build on a site near the starting place of the Pilgrim Fathers here are to be laid on September 6. The ceremony will take place in connection with the tercentenary celebration of the sailing of the Pilgrims.

The stones, which are to be brought from Plymouth, Mass., will be laid by Ambassador Davis, Lady Astor, who is a member of Parliament for the division, and General Booth.

The cost of the scheme is £25,000.

PALESTINE HAS NO POSTAGE STAMPS

LONDON, May 15. (By Mail.)—Palestine is now the only nation which has no postage stamp of its own. But representatives of the Zionist government here have informed London philatelists that this anomaly promises soon to be rectified, for with the establishment of Palestine as the national home of the Jewish nation, it is believed little time will be lost in emulating the examples of other small nations called into being by mandates of the Peace Conference by the issuance of distinctive stamps.

Pending the preparation of definite designs, stamps sold by British Army post-offices in adjacent former enemy territory are being utilized by overprinting with the word "Palestine."
