

Twenty-five thousand German civilan functionaries who occupied positions in Poland and have been deprived of their posts owing to transfers of territory, are in sore plight. The government, which suddenly recalled them gave no thought, apparently, to bousing such a multitude with their wives and families, assigning them to old concentration camps and barracks.
