FRANCISCANS REGAIN LAND

SAN DIEGO, Cal., June 15.—Through an order of court the Franciscan Fathers of California again have acquired title to San Luis Rey Mission. The land involved includes the few acres about the mission and its buildings and a part of San Luis Rey township, proceedings to vacate

which are to be instituted. Patent for this land was signed by President Lincoln on March 18, 1865, to be held in trust for religious purposes by the then Roman Catholic bishop Joseph Sadoe Alemany. Mission San Luis Rey was dedicated June 13, 1798. It is situated about ten miles inland from Ocean-side, Cal., and was located as a day's travel each between Mission San Diego and Mission San Juan Capistrano. The mission was founded by Fathers Lasuen, Santiago and Pezri and in its most prosperous days owned thousands of acres of land in what

is now about the middle of San Diego county, with 60,000 head of domestic animals and had settled in and about it some 3,000 Indians. Some time prior to the government grant which formed the basis for the court action, the Franciscans abandoned all the missions except that at Santa Barbara. In 1885 there were only a few survivors of the "gray friars" branch of the order of St. Francis, which established the mission in California. These petitioned the Franciscans of St. Louis, the "brown friars," to take over the Franciscan establishment in California, which was done that year, when the "gray friars" put aside the gray and donned the brown robe. Brother Peter, the sole survivor of the original "gray friars," now resides at the Franciscan home in Los Angeles. "The Franciscan Fathers of California" is the corporate name of the Franciscan province of Santa Barbara, which includes the Pacific states, Arizona and New Mexico. The action, a friendly one, which determined the boundary of San Luis Rey mission was brought at the solicitation of Father Dominio, its superior, by petition of Rt. Rev. John I. Cantwell, Roman Catholic Bishop of the diocese of Monterey and Los Angeles.
