CALIFORNIA NEWS

MERIDIAN, June 16.—The barley crop in Sutter county is showing up better than was expected by most of the farmers and a yield of from 16 to 20 bushels to the acre is resulting from the harvest which is in progress.

RED BLUFF, June 16.—The Board of Supervisors late Thursday afternoon awarded the contract for the construction of the new county court house to the Mathews Construction company of Sacramento, on an extended plan, which will aggregate the cost of the building at about \$261,000.

NEVADA CITY, June 16.—Joe T. Son, 74, who lived in California for fifty-six years and was one of the old guard of pioneer miners, has passed away. He mined throughout the mining regions of California doing his last work on Deer Creek.

NAPA, June 16.—Mrs. Myra Palmer, an old and highly esteemed resident of Napa, died at her home. Her husband, Dr. Palmer, died a few months ago.

EUREKA, June 16.—Word was received here today of the drowning of Ernest Waldorf in the Trinity river, Tuesday, near the same spot where his mother and sister were drowned forty years ago.

QUINCY, June 16.—According to announcement here by N. F. Golden, Clinton Walker, E. V. Darby and Frank Bell, all of this city, the option they held upon the timber holdings of the Powers Timber company on the Middle Fork of the American river in Placer county has been exercised, and the land has been sold to the Western Lumber company of Reno.

SANTA ROSA, June 16.—Thirty dollars a ton was offered here the past week for new hay, and the indications are that hay will advance to the largest price paid in years, owing to a shortage in Solano, San Joaquin and Sacramento counties.

FORTOLA, June 16.—The ice plant at Gulling has been taken over by the Pacific Fruit Express company, who will commence operations June 15th, and probably continue until September 15th. They expect to load twelve cars daily.

COLUSA, June 16.—John Lamphere, 29, son of Mr. and Mrs. Guy Lamphere of this city, was instantly killed when an automobile in which he was riding was wrecked a mile out of Gridley Friday night. Harold Wilsey, also of Colusa, was injured.

QUINCY, June 16.—Mike Brown, a timber faller at the D. L. G. company's mill, was fatally injured Friday when a limb of a tree fell upon him, crushing his skull.

IONE, June 16.—Funeral services were held here for Mrs. Rachel Myers, who died Monday at the age of 86. She crossed the plains with her husband in 1852, having been married two years previously. Three children were born to the union, two of whom survive. They are Edgar and Oscar Myers. Nine grand-children and as many great-grand-children also survive the aged woman.

LODI, June 16.—A few minutes after he had complained of a severe pain in his heart, Carl Wildermuth, formerly owner of the White House restaurant, died, a victim of valvular heart disease.

WESTWOOD, June 16.—Camp 24 of the Red River Lumber company was completely burned down in a fire starting from the woods and fanned by a high wind.

Twenty-five cabins, six camp dining and kitchen cars and meat house were destroyed. The estimated loss is \$18,000.

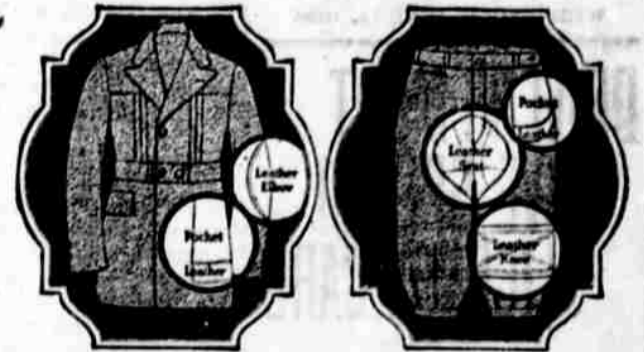
