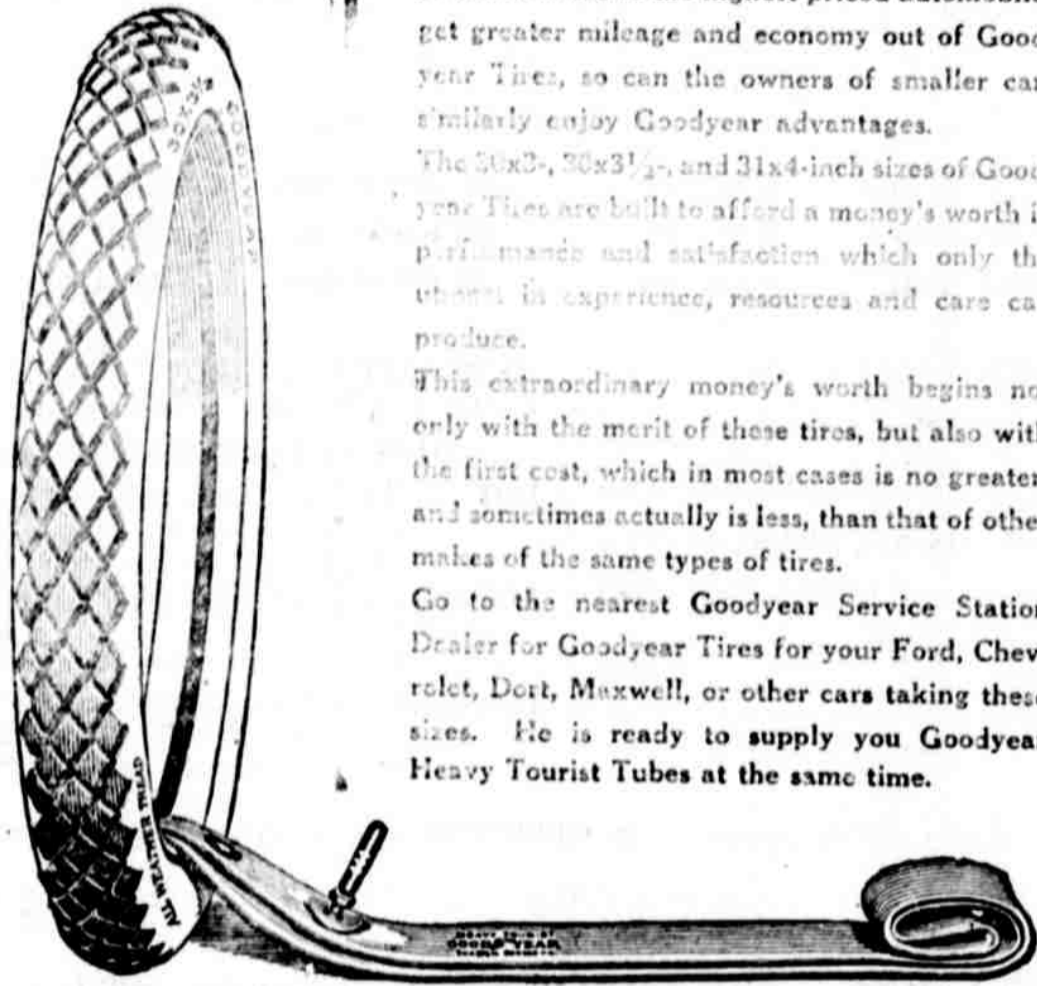

Pursuant to ordinance and order of the Common Council of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, notice is hereby given that proposals will be received by said Common Council for making the improvement designed for improvement of Washington street from First street to Third street including intersections. Said improvement to be made in accordance with the plans and specifications of the City Engineer and for one of the classes of improvement mentioned in said plans and specifications and the ordinance ordering said improvement, which said ordinance is numbered 505 and was adopted on the 7th day of June, 1929, and approved by the mayor on the 8th day of June, 1929.
