### RELIGIOUS ZEALOT CRUCIFIED; SURVIVES

MEXICO CITY, May 20. (By Mail.)—Dr. Jose di Gabriele, the crucified by the Indian inhabitants of Tequistlan, Oaxaca, last Good Friday, arrived recently in Mexico City, enroute to his home in Pachuca, apparently little the worse physically, but still harboring his beliefs.

Dr. Gabriele appeared in Oaxaca early in Lent, proclaiming himself to be the Savior and so worked on the superstitious and ignorant Indians that they crucified him, using railway spikes to nail him to a crude cross. He was taken down the next day and survived his ordeal, being viewed by thousands on Easter.

News of the crucifixion reached the capital of the state, Tehuantepec and the governor ordered Di Gabriele brought there. A great procession followed the cart in which he was transported. Later the mayor of Tequistlan, who acted as the Roman centurion and four other principal figures in the crucifixion, were arrested.

### RUMANIA IN NEED OF MANY BRIDGES

CONSTANTZA, Rumania, May 21. (By Mail.)—Owing to the general destruction of bridges during the war there is an exceptional opportunity in Rumania for American bridge builders. A bridge over the Danube to connect Rumania with Serbia is being considered by the Rumanian government. There are 18 important bridges in other parts of Rumania awaiting reconstruction. In addition, the great bridge over the Danube at Cernavoda, in many respects the greatest structure in Europe, must be reconstructed. This bridge, known as the King Carol bridge, is 1260 feet long and 11.4 feet above high water.
