## OLD GAMBLING HOUSE CHANGED TO HOSPITAL

SHANGHAI, May 12. (By Mail.)—The great gambling establishment in this city notorious for years under the name of "The Wheel," which originally cost more than \$500,000 is to be converted into a charity hospital. The Chinese authorities have announced that they intend to confiscate the huge building which now stands dark and empty. Its owners, however, threaten to fight this program.

Up to about three years ago when the place was closed by Chinese authorities "The Wheel" in Shanghai was one of the biggest gambling establishments in the Far East. It was located in Chinese territory on North Honan road, a 15 minute automobile ride from the heart of the city. In the days when the establishment flourished, three roulette wheels with six lay-outs, beside faro and other games were operated.

After this establishment was closed as the result of the efforts of missionary interests no open gambling on any large scale was permitted in Shanghai until last fall when the interests that formerly operated "The Wheel" opened near it a smaller roulette establishment which in turn was closed after a few weeks.
