### NOTICE INVITING PROPOSALS TO MAKE STREET IMPROVEMENT

Pursuant to ordinance and order of the Common Council of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, notice is hereby given that proposals will be received by said Common Council for making the improvement designed for improvement of Washington street from First street to Third street including intersections. Said improvement to be made in accordance with the plans and specifications of the City Engineer and for one of the classes of improvement mentioned in said plans and specifications and the ordinance ordering said improvement, which said ordinance is numbered 695 and was adopted on the 7th day of June, 1926, and approved by the mayor on the 8th day of June, 1926.

Said plans, specifications and estimates of the City Engineer being on file in the office of the Police Judge and in the office of the said engineer. The proposed contract will be let in one contract, and the time in which the same is to be completed is fixed by said ordinance on or before October 15th, 1926. The City of Klamath Falls reserving the right at all times to reject any and all proposals. The award to the successful bidder is hereby made contingent upon the sale of the bonds that will be authorized for providing funds for making such improvement.
