The star recently explained the functions of the government man-hunting agencies, as follows:

"The United States Secret Service is a department of the treasury, commanded by the Secretary of the Treasury and concerning itself principally with the running down of counterfeiters. It is from this organization that the President's body guard is selected and the men of this service are always assigned to accompany a visiting official from another country."

"The Department of Justice operates another bureau of investigation; an organization whose operatives run down enemies of the country, violators of inter-state and international law and criminals who have defrauded either this government or another."

"In addition to these two secret organizations the treasury department maintains a special agent in each important city to track smugglers and those who have evaded the payment of customs duty. The postoffice department has inspectors who concern themselves with mail frauds, thefts from the mails and the robbery or defalcation of postoffices."

DISCOURAGED OVER RUSSIA

CONSTANTINOPLE, May 28. (By Mail).—Nikolai Tschalkowski, the veteran Russian reformer, has arrived in Constantinople from the Crimea much discouraged as to the immediate prospect for a reunited Russia.

Before joining the Denikine government at Ekaterinodar six months ago, M. Tschalkowski was a member of the committee in Paris which was working for the perpetuation of Russia and numbered Prince Lvov, Sazonoff, Maklakoff, Savinkoff and Bakmetieff among its membership.

In the seventies he went to America with his wife and was one of twenty Russians who started a new religion and established a colony near Independence, Kans. That experiment lasted for only two years.

FRENCH CONTROL WORKING WELL

ADRIANOPLE, June 1. (By Mail).—The French administration accompanied by a small army of occupation, in Western Thrace, is being pointed to here as an example of the benefits a mandate would accomplish under the League of Nations.

The French civil administration began its work in the latter part of last November, and into a country full of warring bands of various nationalities, it has brought peace and order, permitted the planting of crops, and the normal pre-war life of the country to be pursued.

When the French took over the country every man's hand was raised against the other. Alarmists rumors about the arrival of the British and Greek, Bulgar and Turkish troops were circulated frequently.

The French have in all, including constabulary, not more than 500 of their own chief administrators. These are generally officers detailed from the army who have had experience in the French colonies.

When the French came they had 1,500,000 francs put at their disposal by their government for administrative expenses but so far they have not spent one franc of this sum.

Public order has been so easily maintained that in the district of Karamatch only three French gendarmes, each with 12 local men under his command, were required.
