### TAHOE FOXES DO NOT THRIVE WELL

TAHOE CITY, Cal., June 25.—The first litter of fox puppies born at the Kirman fox farm, established near Lake Tahoe last fall, survived only a few days, due it is believed, to improper feeding.

This again reduces the fox population to two. Of the four silver gray animals brought from Prince Edward Island, two escaped, one being killed in the wilds later and the other never heard of.

Richard Kirman, the proprietor, plans to bring four additional animals from Prince Edward Island next fall.

### TURKS FOND OF PORK AND BEANS

SAN FRANCISCO, June 25.—The popularity of American pork and beans in Constantinople is affected but little by the ruling of the prophet Mahomet that his followers should not eat pigs' flesh, according to Elliot Grinnell Mears, of the Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce of the United States government, who was a delegate to the recent National Foreign Trade Convention here. Six hundred thousand Greeks who are part of Constantinople's total population of 1,400,000, are a good prospective market for the American canned product. Mears states, although the Mohammedans steadfastly refuse to eat pork and beans, Mears is honorary vice-president of the American Chamber of Commerce for the Levant and formerly was a professor at Harvard.

### LATE RAINS KEEP FOREST FIRES DOWN

MISSOULA, Mont., June 25.—Unusually heavy and persistent rainfall throughout the western part of Montana and northern Idaho is given by local headquarters officials of the forest service as the reason for the fact that there have been no forest fires reported this season as yet. One year ago at this time, there were several disastrous conflagrations burning through district No. 1. At the same time, the rains have been of great help to the crops and farm prospects are said to be excellent.
