WASHINGTON, June 25.—Benedict Crowell, assistant secretary of war, has resigned, effective July 1, and plans to enter private business.

LONDON, June 25.—The Greek legation here received official information that the Greeks campaigning against Turkish nationalists in the Smyrna district have surrounded the Turkish army corps 85 miles east of Smyrna, taking 8,000 prisoners and many guns.

THE HAGUE, June 25.—The commission of jurists in session here for the formation of a permanent court of justice as provided in the league of nations covenant has unanimously decided that this court will be located at The Hague.
