PERMITS ISSUED TO 14 KLAMATH CO. WATER USERS

According to the records of Percy A. Cupper, state engineer, between January 1 and June 1, of this year, 263 permits to appropriate water, and 19 permits to construct reservoirs have been issued by his office. Of this number, 13 permits have been granted covering the appropriation of water for the development of approximately 9,300 horsepower, 198 permits covering the appropriation of water for the irrigation of 41,635 acres of land, and 19 permits covering the appropriation of water for mining purposes. The remaining 43 permits cover domestic use, water for stock, municipal and various other uses.

Under the various permits it is contemplated that approximately 240 miles of canals will be constructed, and the various features of construction work will cost approximately \$1,600,000.

Klamath County Permits

In Klamath county, the following permits have been issued:

To C. L. Holladay, of Klamath Falls, covering the appropriation of water from Klamath river for irrigation of 231 acres of land.

To Plevna District Improvement company, of Klamath Falls, to appropriate water from Klamath river for irrigation of 579 acres. The estimated construction cost is approximately \$6,000.

To H. H. Van Valkenburg, of Klamath Falls, covering the appropriation of water from Klamath river for irrigation of 140 acres.

To H. A. Talbot and C. C. Whitmore, of Klamath Falls, covering the appropriation of water from Klamath river for irrigating 125 acres.

To Mrs. J. D. Hooper, of Klamath Falls, covering the appropriation of water from Klamath river for irrigation purposes.

To J. F. Adams, of Klamath Falls, to appropriate water from Klamath river for irrigating 1,578 acres, at an estimated cost of \$18,000.

To R. J. Riddle, of Copco, California, covering the appropriation of water from Cascade springs for irrigation purposes.

To C. W. and L. A. De Carlow, of Pinehurst, covering the appropriation of water from Little Beaver creek, for irrigation purposes.

To H. F. Murdock, of Klamath Falls, to appropriate water from Klamath river for irrigation purposes and domestic use.

To William Devaul, of Lorella, covering appropriation of water from a spring for irrigation of 150 acres.

To G. G. Kerns, of Klamath Falls, covering appropriation of water from Klamath river for irrigation of 253 acres of land.

To J. P. McAuliffe, of Fort Klamath, covering the appropriation of water from Wood river for irrigation purposes.

To Ed Copperfield, of Yainax, covering the appropriation of water from Whisky creek for irrigation of 35 acres.

The Talent Irrigation district has secured permit from the office of the state engineer covering the construction of the Emigrant reservoir for the storage of 11,000 acre feet of water from Keene and Emigrant creeks, for irrigation of the lands within the district.
