BOARD SHIES AT GOVT. CONTRACT

The directors of the Klamath Irrigation district at their meeting Monday formally discussed the contract submitted by the government for the taking over by the district of operation and maintenance of the distribution system. While no definite action was taken, it is reported that the contract in its present form is not acceptable.

The principal difficulty lies in the fact that the government would retain control of the main canals, head-gates and buildings and all parts of the general system supplying water to lands outside the district. This, directors assert, would result in a dual control and a duplication of labor and cost. For one thing it would virtually mean two sets of ditch tenders, one for the government and one for the district, and other maintenance features would likewise be duplicated.

The directors sentiment, as reported, is that the district, if it takes over the system, should take it over in its entirety.

MANY REASONS FOR VILLA'S ATTITUDE

EL PASO, Texas, June 30.—Revenge, pride, jealousy and fear are given in various stories being told along the Mexican border, as to the motive that led Francisco Villa, the bandit, to refuse to make peace with the new government.

The most pretentious version was told here recently by Fernando Falacios, Mexican journalist, who until recent revolution was a campaign manager for Pablo Gonzales, candidate for the presidency of Mexico.

According to the journalist, negotiations were going smoothly between Villa's emissaries and representatives of the government when the provisional governor of the state of Chihuahua, Tamas Gameros, offered a reward of 100,000 pesos for Villa "dead or alive."

Governor Gameros, according to Falacios, offered the reward to revenge himself against Villa for the death of a son the bandit is credited with killing, and prevent peace being made with the bandit.

Villa, it is said, was advised of the reward and refused to negotiate further, fearing "double cross."

Another story, being told that pride kept Villa from making terms. This story is to the effect Villa was ready and willing to quit, but General P. Elias Callas, minister of war and marine in President de la Huerta's camp refused to meet Villa personally at Villa's camp. Villa sent envoys to Callas but refused offers made by the government officials, because his pride was touched by Callas's refusal to deal personally.

Jealousy of military leaders and fear of some Villa would demand their dismissal for previous attacks on his was still other story in circulation here why he did not enter the fold.

OCEAN CARRIERS WANT RAIL FREIGHT RATE

WASHINGTON, June 30.—The Coastwise Steamship company of the Pacific has petitioned the interstate commerce commission for advances in freight rates equivalent to those asked by the railroads of the west and south. The western roads are asking a 24 per cent increase.
