### SAW SKELETON IN OLD SPRING

Mention made in the Herald a few days ago about the finding of a human skeleton in pioneer days in a spring that, in those days, flowed from the ground about where Winter's jewelry store now stands on Main street, brought forth an interesting reminiscence today from Jeff Wilson, a pioneer resident of the city, whose home is on Oregon avenue. Mr. Wilson came here as a small boy in the early 70's.

The water from the spring was used generally for drinking purposes. Mr. Wilson was at the time attending school in an old building on the site of the present central school and the pupils used the water daily. Travelers passing through Linkville, as the town was then known, stopped and watered their stock at the spring and supplied their canteens and barrels in which they carried water for cooking.

One morning—Mr. Wilson thinks it was in 1872, as he knows the Modoc war was in progress—Judd Small, who had a small land office near by, discovered human bones in the spring, which at that time was so deep that a large pole thrust into it would not touch the bottom. Mr. Wilson thinks it was six or eight feet deep, but the years have dimmed the vividness of his boyish impressions.

The find created much excitement, however, and school was dismissed by the teacher so that the children could see it. Practically all the bones were recovered and wired together by Mr. Small, so that he had a complete skeleton. The bones were never identified. There was some argument as to whether they were the bones of a white man or Indian, but they always remained a mystery.

"We kids, I remember, got pretty sick when we looked at them and thought that we'd been drinking that water right along," said the pioneer.

Finally Small moved to Lakeview and took the skeleton with him. Eventually track was lost of him. The spring was filled up and buildings placed above the site. Main street was laid out and later paved and the old spring was forgotten until excavation for the Liberty theater tapped it's underground flow and recalled memory of its gruesome history to old timers.
