RESOLUTION

The City Engineer, pursuant to Resolution of the Common Council heretofore adopted, having on the 9th day of July 1920, filed plans, specifications and estimates of the cost of improving Main Street from Spring Street easterly to the city limits of Klamath Falls, Oregon, and the Council having taken the same under advisement and finding said plans, specifications and estimates satisfactory.

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, that said plans, specifications and estimates for the improvement of said portions of Main Street from Spring Street westerly to the city limits of Klamath Falls, Oregon, be, and the same are hereby approved, and.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Common Council hereby declares its intention to improve the said portions of Main Street in accordance with the said plans, specifications and estimates, said improvement to consist of paving said portions of said Street with standard bitulithic and cinders at an estimated cost including cement side walks, on the northern side thereof 6 feet wide from Spring Street easterly to the Southern Pacific Railroad track and 5 feet wide from the Southern Pacific Railroad track to the city limits, and curbing and grading, of \$13,538.00.
