QUITS GOV'T WORK AFTER 65 YEARS

WASHINGTON, July 22.—After 65 years of continuous government service, regarded by officials here as a record never before equalled, Henry J. Wylie, clerk in the quartermaster's department of the U. S. marine corps, will retire on August 29 with an annuity. Mr. Wylie has served the marine corps for 45 years in the same department.

Mr. Wylie entered the government service in the postoffice in Pittsfield, Mass., when 17 years old. In 1861 he enlisted in the army and saw service in three of the great battles of the Civil war. At the close of the war he was appointed clerk in the Washington navy yard. He left the navy yard to join the clerical force of the marine corps in 1875.

During his service in the marine corps, Mr. Wylie has administered the oath of office to the following commandants of the corps: Major Generals Heywood, Elliot, Biddle, Barnett and Lejeune.

Mr. Wylie was born in Pittsfield, Mass., in 1838.

CALIFORNIA NEWS

LOS ANGELES, July 22.—Freesia bulbs valued at \$10,000 were destroyed by a fire Saturday at the Fisher Nursery at Arcadia, near here, according to information received in Los Angeles today.

SUTTER CITY, July 22.—Dewitt Bros., of this place, claim a record in the threshing line. They claim to have threshed 500 sacks of barley in two hours and forty minutes.

HOOD, July 22.—Fire which started from a tractor harvesting outfit owned by Seymour Gorter of Clarksville Friday, caused a loss estimated at upwards of \$50,000 in southeastern Yolo and western Sacramento counties.

LOS ANGELES, July 22.—Using a fishing line and hook, a thief obtained \$3,000 in money and jewelry from two apartments, according to reports made to the police.

The thief cut the screens from the windows and then "fished" in the dim morning light. One of his victims woke in time to see his purse vanish through a window, attached to a fish hook.

VALLEJO, July 22.—Having accepted a place of window trimmer in a local business house, the Rev. W. B. Phillips, pastor of the First Christian church, has given up the ministry.

WOODLAND, July 22.—Louis Walker, native of New York, 88 years of age, and for 27 years a prosperous farmer of Yolo county, passed away at his new home in Alhambra, Los Angeles county, last Thursday.

SACRAMENTO, July 22.—The loss in the fire, which partially destroyed the plant of the Sacramento Lumber company on the Twelfth street road Saturday, was placed at between \$75,000 and \$100,000 by

F. E. Conner, president of the company.

SACRAMENTO, July 22.—Ernest M. Crockett, aged 51, a representative for the Virden Packing company with headquarters in Woodland, dropped dead while partaking of an early morning meal at Hart's Lunch, 929 K street.

LOS ANGELES, July 22.—One of the largest stills found here since prohibition became effective was located today in the ruins of a tenement house where a man and a boy were burned to death and two others badly injured according to police and federal authorities.

CHICO, July 22.—Marshal J. A. Beck was astonished Saturday when he accosted Mrs. Durand Gondalaria, an Indian woman, sitting in the park, and asked how her baby was. She bear "Baby dead." Beck learned the woman had sat three hours with the dead baby in her arms because she did not know where to go.

STOCKTON, July 22.—W. F. Williams, believed to have come from San Diego, where his parents live, lies dead in the county morgue from shots fired by law officers in Tracy Saturday night when he was making his escape after arrest.

WOODLAND, July 22.—A. M. Britt, former mayor of the city of Woodland and founder of the Woodland Bottling and Soda Works, died suddenly in San Francisco.
