STANDARD OIL IMPROVES PLANT

After being in the hands of carpenters and painters for the past month, the Standard Oil plant at Sixth and Spring streets, has emerged entirely renovated and much re-modeled. The office building has been enlarged, all the wood work gone over with white paint, and new windows and screens put in.

The yard, which is almost on a level with the lake and becomes soggy and muddy upon the least provocation, is being fixed at present. The surface dirt is being excavated and the yard will be filled with a surface of coarse rock, with a top layer of fine gravel. The old fence was torn down and a new fence, freshly painted, encloses the plant.

The gasoline storage tanks have been raised and a new garage, with stalls for four cars has been built.

The improvement of Standard Oil property did not stop at the main office, however, but was extended to the service station at the corner of Sixth street and Klamath avenue. The regulation Standard Oil service pattern has been followed, the style that distinguished Standard Oil service stations the country over. Fresh paint, new sidewalks, a trim lawn and a general convenient re-arrangement of equipment has made the place neat and modern, and gladdening to the eye of weary travelers stopping here to replenish their gasoline supply.
