NORTHAMPTON, Mass., July 29. "This nomination is tendered you as the spontaneous wish of your party," said Governor Edwin P. Morrow of Kentucky, principal speaker at the ceremonies attending the notification here of Governor Calvin Coolidge of his nomination as candidate of the Republican party for vice president.

"The west called to the east," Governor Morrow said, "north and south heard the call and the nation made the answer."

Governor Morrow attacked the Democratic national administration for what he termed its hesitation. blundering and stubbornness and called the league of nations an attempt to bind the United States to the bloody feuds of Europe.


