and kept free of damage or other refuse for rats.

"Double ceiling should be avoided especially so in basements. Boxed in structures, such as uprights and roughly finished dwellings, plumbing, sinks and the like should be removed. Miscellaneous openings as light shafts, ventilators and windows should be screened preferably by twelve-gauge wire screen with mesh not exceeding one-half inch. The grounds about the buildings are to be devoid of rat harborage and premises are to be kept clean and free of rubbish."

In seaport cities, where the rare species of the brown rat and "Alexandrian" rat prevail, health officials are asked to make surveys to determine the presence or absence of rodent plague.

By starving him, through the use of rat-proof receptacles for food, and covered metal garbage cans.

By depriving him of breeding places, through the abolition of plank yards and passageways.

By refusing him admission to the comfort of your buildings, through rat-proof construction, and screened basement openings.

By killing him at every opportunity.

By demanding city anti-rat ordinances and state anti-rat laws.

**TWO SHIPOADS OF  
OREGON LUMBER ON SEAS**

PORTLAND, July 20.—Built of Oregon timber, laden with a full cargo of Oregon lumber, and owned and managed in Portland, the six-masted schooner, Oregon Fir, will put to sea for Australia in a few days, following her sister ship, the Oregon Pine, which is already on the high seas. These two schooners, which were purchased from the shipping board as hulls and completed by Grant Smith & Co., are the only deep-sea vessels in this state.

American Womanhood Praised.

The womanhood of America, always its glory, its inspiration and the potent uplifting force in its social and spiritual development, is about to be enfranchised. Insofar as congress can go the fact is already accomplished. My party edict, by my recorded vote, by personal conviction, I am committed to this measure of justice. It is my earnest hope, my sincere desire, that the one needed state vote be quickly recorded in the affirmation of the right of equal suffrage and that the vote of every citizen shall be cast and counted on the approaching election.

And to the great number of noble women who have opposed in conviction this tremendous change in the ancient relation of the sexes as applied to government I venture to plead that they will accept the full responsibility of enlarged citizenship and give to the best in the republic their suffrage and support. This is not only a fortunate people but a very common sense people with vision but their feet on the earth, with belief in themselves and faith in God, whether enemies threaten from without or menace from within, there is some indefinable voice saying "Have confidence in the republic; America will go on."
