## CANADIAN FISHERIES

**OTTAWA, Ont., Aug. 7.**—Canadian fisheries for the fiscal year closed March last produced a total commercial revenue in excess of \$60,000,000, or an increase of \$25,000,000 as compared with the previous fiscal year. The export trade in fish for the last fiscal year was worth \$40,687,172, increase over the preceding year of more than \$4,000,000. The export trade with the United Kingdom increased from \$6,726,389 in 1914, to \$9,815,979 last year, whilst the trade with the United States jumped from \$5,644,355 in 1914, to \$17,180,250.
