BETTER FACILITIES FOR WOMEN STUDENTS

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, Aug. 19.—Exceptional opportunities for women will be offered by the University of Oregon during the coming year, as two of the four buildings now being erected by the University are for the exclusive use of women. The new \$300,000 women's building will provide adequate class room facilities, spacious gymnasiums, locker rooms, a swimming tank, offices, rest rooms, and all the equipment and facilities required for the department of physical education for women. The second unit of the women's dormitory, to cost \$200,000, will form the west side of a future woman's quadrangle, with the new women's building on the south, and Hendricks Hall, the present dormitory on the east, and is expected to provide adequate housing facilities for the increased enrollment of women expected for the coming year.

GRAPE GROWERS STILL DOING GOOD BUSINESS

WASHINGTON, August 19.—When the nation went dry by federal amendment many grape growers thought they would be forced into some other line of business because of the subsequent cessation of wine production, but reports to the bureau of markets show that the demand for manufactured grape products now exceeds the supply.

The production of unfermented grape juice and of jams and jellies is utilizing an increasing tonnage of grapes each year, these reports state and in not far distant future it is expected that the annual production of grapes will not meet the demand.
