The Roman Sestertius.

ship of Pacific Northwest.

Sestertius is the Latin name for a Roman coin meaning half of the third. that is, two and half, from "semi" meaning half and "tertius" meaning third.

When silver coinage was introduced in Rome in 208 B. C., with the copper as a unit, the silver sestertius was valued at 2% asses. The standard as retained only one-fourth of its original The sesterilus was equivaweight. lent to the original libral as; and, as accounts had formerly been made in terms of the libral as, they were now made in terms of the sestertil. After the first Punic war, which ended 241 B. C., the sectertius ceased to be coined. The weight of the as was many times reduced. In 217 B. C. the denarius was made equal to 16 asses and the sestertius to 4 asses. With the reorganization of the coinage system under Augustus (63 B. C. to 14 A. Di) a copper sesterilus of 4 notes was coined under the control of the senate. This was about 4 cents in United States money.



SALE OF TIMBER KLAMATH INDIAN RESERVATION LITTLE SPRAGUE UNIT

Sealed bids in duplicate, marked outside "Bid Little Sprague Unit," and addressed to the "Superintend-ent, Klamath Indian School, Klamath ent, Klamath Indian School, Klamath Agency, Oregon," will be received until 2:00 o'clock P. M., Pacific time, Wednesday, October 27, 1920, for the purchase of the merchantable timber on about 3,600 acres on Sprague River in townships 34 and 35 Bouth, Range SEast, Willamette Meridian. This unit is estimated at 40,000,000 feet B. M., mostly west-ern yellow pine of which about 5,000,000 feet is on about 480 acres of approved allotments, and as to which separate approved contracts with the Indian owners may probof approved allotments, and as to which separate approved contracts with the Indian owners may prob-ably be made.
