BRAZIL COTTON **BUREAU STARTED**

RIO DE JANEIRO, Aug. 25, (By Mail)-Increased and improved production of cotton especially in north-Lawrence K. Phelps, care Houston eastern Brazil, a great potential producing center which is at present quite undeveloped, is the object of a Cotton Service Bureau recently established by presidential decree.

The bureau will investigate the properties of the soil and climatic conditions, and establish experimental stations to study the clulture of cotton and preventative measures agains pests and plant diseases. Planters in the cotton zones will be provided with machinery, implements and fertilizers at cost prices. and establishments will be installed for preparing cotton for the market.
