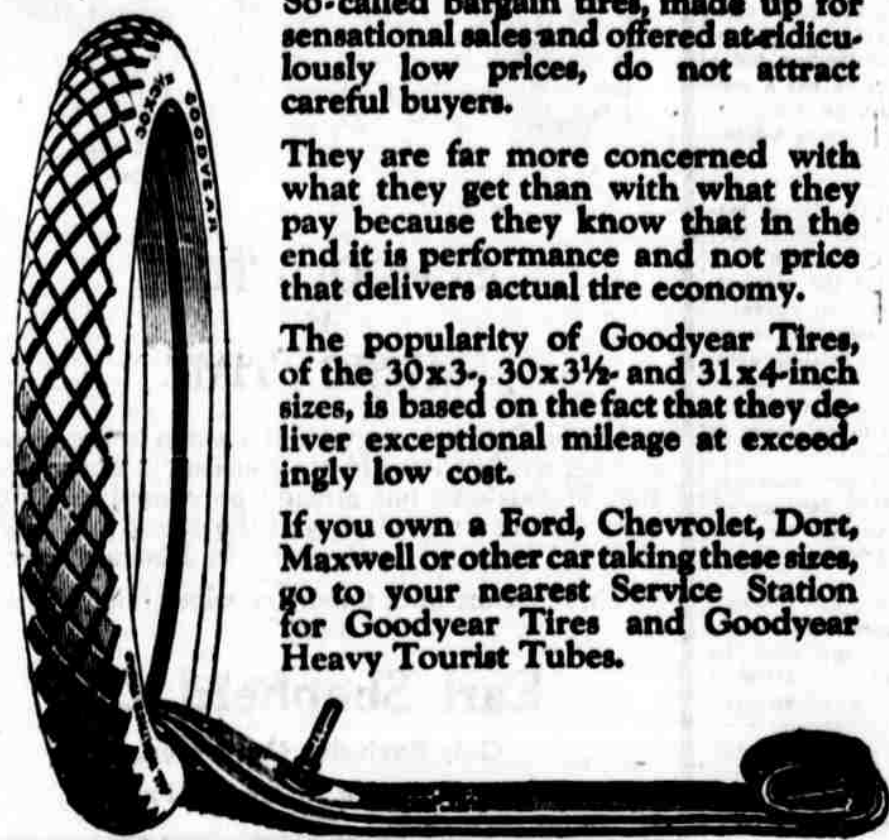

ARGENTINE HOLDS OIL RIGHTS HIGH

BUENOS AIRES, Aug. 3. (By Mail)—Argentina has refused a British offer of £10,000,000 for the control of the government's petroleum producing properties, maintaining its traditional attitude of guarding these deposits for the benefit of the nation. The offer was

made by Frederick White, representing the Cowdray interests. While the government's petroleum fields at Comodoro Rivadavia are producing approximately 200,000 tons of petroleum annually, the fuel shortage in the nation has given rise to agitation for more extensive development. A dispatch from London quotes Mr. White as explaining that President Irigoven expressed himself as anxious for increased produc-

tion but that he was unwilling to see the exploitation taken out of the hands of the Argentine people. Other offers for these fields have been refused in the past, including offers from North American promoters. POLYGAMY IN PHILIPPINES IS DECLINING

MANILA, P. I., Sept. 1.—Practice of polygamy in the Philippine Islands is being reduced through education of girls of the leading families of the outlying provinces, according to Frank W. Carpenter, retiring governor of the Department of Mindanao and Sulu.

Mr. Carpenter is here to turn over administration of his office to the Secretary of the Interior who will act through the bureau of Non-Christian Tribes in accordance with a new territorial law. This law leaves in effect a treaty under which the Sultan of Sulu renounced all pretensions to temporal sovereignty but gained recognition as ecclesiastical head of the Mohammedan church in the Sulu archipelago. The treaty guarantees to the Sultan and his people "the same religious freedom had by all adherents of all other religious creeds, the practice of which is not in violation of the basic principles of the laws of the United States."

"It is important to note," said Carpenter in one of his messages written as governor, "that this includes a limitation as to religious practice which necessarily includes the abandonment of polygamy. There can be no question that it will disappear as the relative number of persons of the two sexes reach an approximate natural equality."

"An effort to impose upon the people of the Sultan at this time the invalidation of polygamous marriages heretofore contracted, the prohibition at this time of polygamy or the discontinuance of divorce, must, unavoidably result in the active resistance of a people imbued with fanatic determination to die rather than submit to a privation of their religious liberty in matters they believe to be fundamental and sanctioned by divine authority."

Mr. Carpenter said that girls of prominent families in Mindanao and Sulu are being sent to Manila public schools where they associated with Christian girls and gradually become imbued with the monogamous ideas held by the Christians. The girls are advised to adhere strictly to their own Mohammedan religion as their influence, it is said, would be destroyed if they abandoned it. When they return to their own people their influence tends to eliminate plural marriages, according to Carpenter, who predicted that the practice will be virtually wiped out in the course of a few years.

PENDLETON, Ore., Sept. 1.—Richard E. ("Dick") Hanley, captain of the noted Mare Island Marines football team of 1918 and former Washington State College star quarter back, is to coach the Pendleton High School football team this year. Hanley will teach chemistry at the school.

TACOMA, Wash., Sept. 1.—Gene Turney, considered by many critics as one of the leading heavyweights prospects, is now at Camp Lewis, Wash., near here, a member of the Fifty Fifth Artillery. Recently he knocked out Ole Anderson, Tacoma heavyweight.
