COOS AND CURRY FAIR SEPT. 15

The Coos and Curry county fair and round-up, to be held at Myrtle Point September 15, 16, 17 and 18, will be the largest event of the kind ever held in southern Oregon. A large number of contestants, both cowboys and cowgirls, who will participate in the events, will also take part in the Pendleton stampede immediately following the Myrtle Point events. The fair association has been very liberal this year with prizes and will have a continuous program, with no idle moments the entire four days of the fair. The relay race will be a big feature, with three relay strings now in training on the track, which is declared by many horsemen to be the fastest track in Oregon today. With its cowboys, cowgirls, riders, Indians and other wild-west characters Myrtle Point is to be a wild and woolly town during the four days and nights of the fair. Riders from five states will be present and will have a string of the hardest bucking horses in the world to handle.

Henry Clark, champion rider of California, who has ridden in all the big round-ups, and usually is in on the money, will be in attendance.

The famous Red Harvey of Pendleton will be on hand to do the dangerous drunken ride, Roman and trick riding each day of the fair.

The Rube with his company is considered one of the greatest clowns on the turf and has his mule trained to perfection.

Elmo of Pendleton and Montana Jack Karfer will be present.

The association offers a prize of \$100 for the best rider. White Cloud will not be entered in this contest, but it is a condition of the contest that the winner must ride this horse.

One hundred dollars is offered for any horse that cannot be ridden.

In addition to these round-up features, the association expects the finest assemblage of fine stock ever shown in the state outside of the state fair and international livestock exposition. Several world record animals, and coming record animals will be shown.

The community exhibition features for fine prizes will also be of more than ordinary interest. Several communities of this section are out after first money with great earnestness and the results will be surprising.
