**U. S. PASSENGER RATE STILL HAS EUROPE BEATEN**

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 17.—In the face of the increased passenger rates the American public, which shows no disposition to forego its love of travel, may take comfort in the fact that it is still paying less for its transportation service than any other country in the world.

The Southern Pacific company has gone to some pains to compare traveling costs on the basis of present passenger rates in this and foreign countries; and the results are both interesting and illuminating.

For example—in Great Britain the present first class rate between London and Glasgow, a distance of 401.50 miles, reduced to American equivalent at the normal rate of exchange, is \$24.70. The California traveler may go from Los Angeles to Houston, 400.2 miles, for \$14.62, plus \$4.50 Pullman, or a total of \$19.62.

The American who goes abroad will pay \$12.35 to go first class from London to Liverpool, a distance of 392.5 miles—but in his own country he can be whisked from San Francisco to Red Bluff, 195 miles, for \$10.20, including \$3.00 Pullman.

The same comparison, it is said, holds true with the rates from Paris, France, to various points on the continent. The traveler going from Paris to Antwerp, 226.18 miles, pays \$14.14, whereas in this country he can go from San Francisco to Fresno, 205 miles, for \$7.44 plus \$3.00 Pullman.

**ENLIST IN MARINES TO SEEK RELATIVES**

WASHINGTON, Sept. 17.—Ponderous government machinery gave way to sentiment today when Major General John A. Lejeune, commandant of the marine corps, authorized the re-enlistment in Los Angeles of two Americans who served in the A. E. F., Peter Mowgofian and Parash Normanian, for the purpose of joining the marines on the U. S. S. Chattanooga, now at Constantinople, in order that they might locate lost relatives in the Near East.

Both of these young men speak Armenian, Greek, Arabic, Bulgarian, French and English, and understand Russian. They will leave Philadelphia this month, via the U. S. S. St. Louis, for Turkish waters.

A marathon race will be one of the principal features of the first annual American Legion field games to be held at Franklin field September 18.

The program of the Maryland State Fair association for its fall meeting at Laurel provides for the distribution of \$317,500 in added money.
