In the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon, for Klamath County. Oregon, California and Eastern Railway Company, a corporation, Plaintiff, vs. Frank M. Sherman and Sherman, his wife; John W. Sherman and Sherman, his wife; Horsefly Irrigation District. Defendants.

In the name of the State of Oregon to Frank M. Sherman and Sherman, his wife; John W. Sherman and Sherman, his wife, defendants, you are hereby required to appear or answer the complaint filed against you in the above entitled action on or before November 6th, 1920, that being the last day of the time prescribed in the order of the publication of this summons. If you fail to appear or answer, plaintiff will apply to the Court for the relief prayed for in his complaint herein to-wit: for the appropriation to plaintiff's use for all proper railroad purposes of the following described real property:
