

O. A. C. GRID WARRIORS ARE WORKING HARD

OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, Corvallis, Sept. 27.—Football prospects look good for the coming year at the college. Coach R. B. Rutherford is rapidly moulding the varsity aspirants into a good fighting machine, and speaks encouragingly of the new men. Much good kicking material has been already uncovered.

A number of old men are working out. "Gap" Powell, fullback, around whom the team will be built, "Babe" McCart and "Kid" McFadden have started training.

The first game of the season will be at Corvallis, October 9, with Pacific university. The following week Multnomah athletic club will play on the home field. O. A. C. will go to Seattle to play the University of Washington, October 23.

University of California will play at Corvallis, October 30. The local stars will go to Pullman for a tussle with W. S. C. November 13, no game having been scheduled for November 6. The annual classic between University of Oregon and O. A. C. occurs on the home field this year November 20. The new grandstand is going up rapidly, and will be ready for the California game November 29.

KLAMATH MINT COMPANY BUSY

The company was authorized some time ago to sell \$50,000 of its capital stock to investors. Manager Davies and Paul Bogardus have been soliciting the sale of shares, and Saturday the company issued the stock, already sold. They still have a few more shares to offer; all shares are \$100 par value, non-assessable, and backed by 1 1/4 acres of the richest marsh lands in Klamath County, located on the Caledonia marsh on Upper Klamath Lake.
