FRANCE LOSING LEAD IN SILKS

WASHINGTON, Oct. 1.—Comparative figures on silk production, based on the last crop would seem to indicate that France is losing its supremacy in the silk industry. A report from the European division of the bureau of commerce says, however, that great increases in production were noted in the countries of the east and particularly the Levant. Silk production in France this year satisfied but 19 per cent of the

domestic requirement despite liberal bounties offered for silk culture. Italy in 1919 produced 10 times as much silk as France and bids fair to maintain that lead while Milan is rapidly eclipsing Lyons as a silk manufacturing center, the report continued.
