

**MILLIONAIRES FRIEND
DIES IN ADVERSITY**

QUINCY, Calif., Oct. 4.—Charles W. Hendel, known to his friends as "Quicksilver Charlie," who died recently at the mining town of La Porte, near the summit of the Sierra Nevada, was once an associate of the Fairs, Mackeys and oth-

er mining magnates of the middle era of California and Nevada. Hendel, however, did not share any of the fortunes accumulated by his friends.

At the time of his death, Hendel, it was believed, was over 100 years old. When he became 90 he became snowfall observer at La Porte for the United States weather bureau. Often his duties called him afield.

**EL PASO FAIR
STARTS TODAY**

EL PASO, Texas, Oct. 4.—El Paso beginning today, holds its first International Exposition to celebrate the return of peace to Mexico and a renewal of friendly feeling between American and the Mexican peoples. Mexican Day, October 6, will be the big event of the exposition week. The fair closes October 9.

General Ignacio Enriquez, governor-elect of Chihuahua state, will represent President de la Huerta at the exposition. Governors of Sinaloa, Coahuila and Tamaulipas have also been invited and several have accepted.

Governors of Texas, New Mexico and Arizona have accepted invitations to attend the exposition on their respective state days.

Mexican and American exhibits of mining, agricultural and manufacturing products will be displayed. Among the exhibits will be a state mineral exhibit from the Chihuahua City palace, an exhibit of Coahuila and Durango and agricultural displays from Mormon colonies of western Chihuahua.

Plans are being made to construct a permanent exposition building here and to make the fair an annual event. Officers would be maintained in the building to give information about the natural resources of the two republics.

On October 10 a party of 100 El Paso business men will leave on a special train for Mexico City and other important Mexican cities.

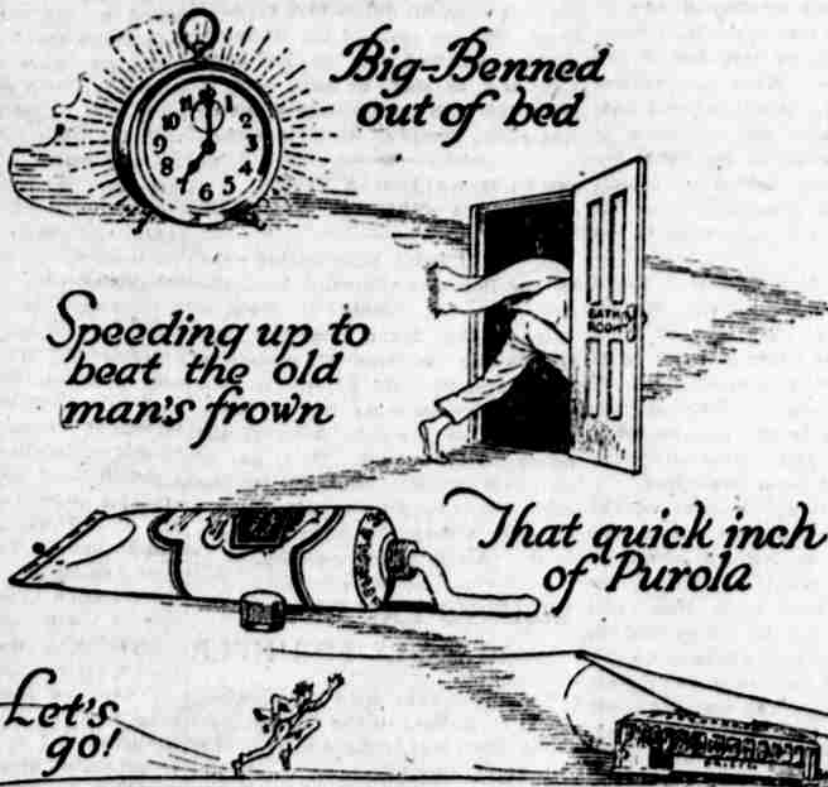
