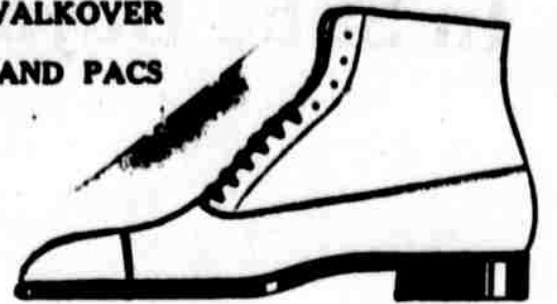

Harding; if that is what you want, put Senator Harding where he can Americanize America and where he can Americanize any agreement designed to remove the peril of war; if that is your desire elect the Republican senators upon whom Senator Harding can rely when he is elected to carry out his policies.

When President Wilson first brought home the league of nations, the idea of a league of nations captivated perhaps nearly all but a few farseeing Americans.
