pointment and defining his powers and duties. The meaning of this is simply that

that man,—that mortal,—hasn't been born who is big enough, and wise enough, and omniscient enough to go among those foreign powers and represent carte blanche 110 million people of the United States. When our forefathers created our constitution they provided that each state is entitled to be represented by two senators and as many representatives as provided by the constitution or by legislation. And the senate of the United States was unwilling, and I am unwilling, to commission any one man to represent the United States in that league of nations, and by his vote,—even taking President Wilson's construction of it,—by his vote, impose upon the people and the congress of the United States what President Wilson calls a moral obligation superior to and more compelling than any legal obligation.

I am not willing to surrender that right to any individual, barring only the divinity of Christ himself, that man was never born who is competent to represent our interests in peace and our interests in war, and, therefore, these pigmy-minded gentlemen, senators of the

TOMORROW "THE VALLEY OF DOUBT"

United States, put in this provision that such a representative shall be appointed only pursuant to an act of congress providing for his appointment and defining his powers and duties, so that the congress of the United States could have some control over America's representative, could have some strings on him, so that he would not get into this foreign crowd and be subject to the fastidious wiles of foreign influence that Washington has advised us against.

What is the next reservation? That the United States shall not be obliged to contribute to any expenses of the league of nations or the secretary act unless the congress of the United States so authorizes.

We are unwilling to give to a foreign secretary—he has already been appointed,—the right to impose upon the United States a moral obligation to take money out of the pockets of the taxpayers.

What is the next reservation? That no plan for the limitation of armament proposed by the council of the league of nations under article eight, shall be held as binding the United States until the same shall have been accepted by our congress, and the United States reserved the right to increase its armament without the consent of the council whenever the United States is threatened with invasion or engaged in war.

That reservation is so plain that it needs no explanation.

Then there is the reservation to article 10, the most important article in the whole league of nations. In it the members of the league undertake to respect and to preserve against external aggression the territorial integrity and existing political independence of all members of the league.
