

## TURNING OUT SKILLFUL WORK

The correct method of teaching "the young idea how to shoot" prevails in the manual training department of the public schools. This statement is supported by the results attained by Professor R. W. Clays' pupils, who have on display in the manual training room of the Central school on array of toys, animals and other things—that implies application, dexterity, and best of all a system of teaching that is producing practical results. Just at the present time the boys are specializing in toys, which will be disposed of at a bazaar to be held at some opportune time. The manufacturing of these toys is also more evidence that the accepted theory that toy making is peculiar to German genials more than to the genius of other people is a fallacy. The boys have also contracted to make 21 wooden waste baskets for the school board, and later in the year they will turn their

attention to the manufacture of more pretentious things, such as desks, tables and chairs.

There are 21 carpenter benches in the manual training room, with a full set of tools for each bench. The manual training course includes mechanical and architectural drawing, a drawing and blue print of each article made being required of the boy engaged in its manufacture.

When the Herald representative visited the manual training room, about 20 boys from the fifth grade were at work, and each pupil was deeply interested in his task.

While very satisfactory progress is being made, better progress could be made if the boys had more room and perhaps more extensive equipment. But the boys are doing excellent work under present conditions, and will set up a record for other classes to shoot at that will be extremely hard to hit even after the acquisition of the needed extra equipment.
