The musicians of Klamath Falls organized a union Saturday evening at a meeting at the central labor council hall, with 23 charter members. B. C. McCoppen was elected temporary president, and Mrs. Sarah Osborn was elected temporary secretary.

The meeting was called by Edward F. Crawford of the Mondak theatre, who states that the organization of musicians will result in the uncovering of much unsuspected talent and will bring about the formation of a municipal band at an early date.

The next meeting will be held Sunday. The charter membership fee has been reduced to \$5 and the charter will remain open 30 days.

Players of brass instruments, especially bass, are needed for the organization of the band. There is a scarcity of such players in the membership so far and the organized musicians would be glad to receive men who can fill the gaps.
