GEOGRAPHICAL FACTS SECURED FROM SURVEY

WASHINGTON Oct. 14.— The
farthest east, west, north and south
points on the United States main
land have been determined by the
United States geological survey
which announces that the easternmost
point is West Quoddy Head, near
Eastport, Maine; the westernmost
point, Cape Alva, Washington; the
farthest north, a small detached land
era of northern Minnesota ending
in latitude 49 degrees, 23 minutes
and longitude 95 degrees, 9 min-
utes, the southernmost point, Cape
Sable, Florida, while the Florida
keys extend farther south.

Data determined and compiled by
the geological survey contains some
interesting facts not generally
known. Some of these are:

The gross area of the United
States is 3,026,789 square miles.
The land area is 2,973,774
square miles.

The water area, exclusive of the
Great Lakes, the Atlantic, the Pa-
cific and the Gulf of Mexico, within
the three-mile limit, is 53,015
square miles.

From the easternmost point, West
Quoddy Head, due west to the Pa-
cific ocean the distance is 2,807
miles.

The shortest distance from Atlan-
tic to Pacific, between points near
Charleston, S. C. and San Diego, Cal.,
is 2,152 miles.

The Canadian boundary is 3,898
miles long.

The Mexican boundary is 1,744
miles long.

The Atlantic coast line is 5,560
miles long.

The Pacific coast line is 2,730
miles long.

The Gulf of Mexico coast line is
2,440 miles long.

Cuba, if transposed directly north,
would extend from New York city
to Indiana with Havana farther west
than Cleveland.

The Panama Canal is due south
of Pittsburgh, Pa.

Nome, Alaska, is farther west than
Hawaii.

13 MILLION TONS CARRIED

NEW YORK, Oct. 14.—Vessels of
the United States shipping board car-
ried 13,379,334 tons of export mer-
chandise and 7,335,165 tons of im-
ports during the fiscal year ended
June 30 last, according to a state-
ment of shipping board activities
made public here today. The cargo
carried, the report states, consti-
tuted 30 per cent of the country's ex-
port business and 27 per cent of the
imports, the percentages being fixed
on the return of the total foreign
commerce of the United States for
the fiscal year.

The business of the shipping
board was handled through 49 Amer-
ican ports, New York ranking first
with 22.3 per cent of the exports and
36.6 per cent of the imports, or 27.9
per cent of the total business. Balto-
more and Philadelphia ranked sec-
ond, each with 10 per cent, and New
Orleans third with 7.6 per cent.

The north Atlantic district, includ-
ing 11 ports from Baltimore north,
handled nearly 48 per cent of the
export business and 58 per cent of
the imports; the south Atlantic dis-
trict handled 19 per cent of the com-
bined exports and imports and the
gulf district 16.7 per cent. The Pa-
cific division handled 11 per cent.

Exports were forwarded to 20 for-
eign trade regions, 19 of which re-
turned imports, Iceland being the
exception. Included among the im-
ports handled were 1,730,733 tons
of crude petroleum, constituting 24
per cent of the total import business.
