**PIGS TIP IT OFF**

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Oct. 23.—The actions of a goose and a pig, observed by prohibition enforcement officers, here recently led to the arrest of Garcia Fernandez and Jose Lopez on a charge of manufacturing liquor illicitly. The officers first saw the creatures from a distance. They are said to have occupied more of the road than usually is allotted to such animals. The officers captured them, but observing about both an aroma associated with products of distillation, allowed them to go free. Trailing the strangely assorted pair, the officers were led to a farmyard where a feed trough reiterated the peculiar odor. Clatter of pans and a sound of human voices led the officers to a nearby building and the arrests followed.

**RECEIPTS AND OUTLAYS FILED BY BOTH SIDES**

WASHINGTON, Oct. 22.—The democratic national committee had expended \$699,071 up to October 21, according to a report filed today with the clerk of the house of representatives by Treasurer Marsh. The total receipts for the campaign were \$677,943. The republican national committee, through Treasurer Upham, reported receipts of \$3,466,019 and expenditures of \$2,741,503. Governor Cox was listed as a subscriber to the democratic fund, donating \$5000. The largest democratic individual subscription was H. A. Wro of Austin, Texas, who gave \$20,000, and the second, largest was Rembrandt Peale of Carrolton, Pennsylvania, who contributed \$10,000.

Because of the shortage of natural gas and the very serious situation in the artists' gas industry, due to scarcity of oil and coal, the public school children in Ohio are given special instruction in the methods of gas conservation.
