**PETTY THEFT SERIOUS BLOW TO THE LOSER**

Probably the person or persons responsible for the theft of Mrs. Al. Rutherford's chickens yesterday did not know how deep an outrage he, or they, committed. The Herald is going to tell the story, in hope that it meets the eyes of the guilty person, or persons, that conscience will lead them to restitution.

Mrs. Rutherford, who is more than 70 years old, lives in the Orindale district. Her husband is also past 70. She brought a box of chickens, value \$10, to town yesterday for a customer on Johnson avenue. The money would have meant a lot to the old couple, who are getting old for hard work and depend entirely for their living on the produce of their little farm. Life for them is a rather hard struggle.

The woman for whom the chickens were meant was not at home, and Mrs. Rutherford tied her horse in front of another friend's house and went inside to rest and await her customer's return. When she came out, the brave old lady found her chickens and the rope with which they were tied in the vehicle had all been taken away. It needs only a little imagination to picture her despair—the money that she had worked and waited for and counted upon for weeks and months gone.

It may have been the criminal action of some one old enough to know better, or it might have been a thoughtless trick of youngsters, but want the guilty person, or persons, please return the chickens or send Mrs. Rutherford the money equivalent that is so badly needed.

Later—a lost ad was inserted in the Herald today by the Sunset grocery, stating that a coop of chickens was picked up in the road near the White Pelican, and is awaiting the owner's claim at the grocery.

The circumstances point to the probability that the maker of the fowls became frightened and abandoned them. If it was a Halloween prank, it was in poor taste.

Mrs. Rutherford knows that the chickens were in her rig when she stopped at her friend's house, as she looked out of the window and saw them to see if they were all there.
