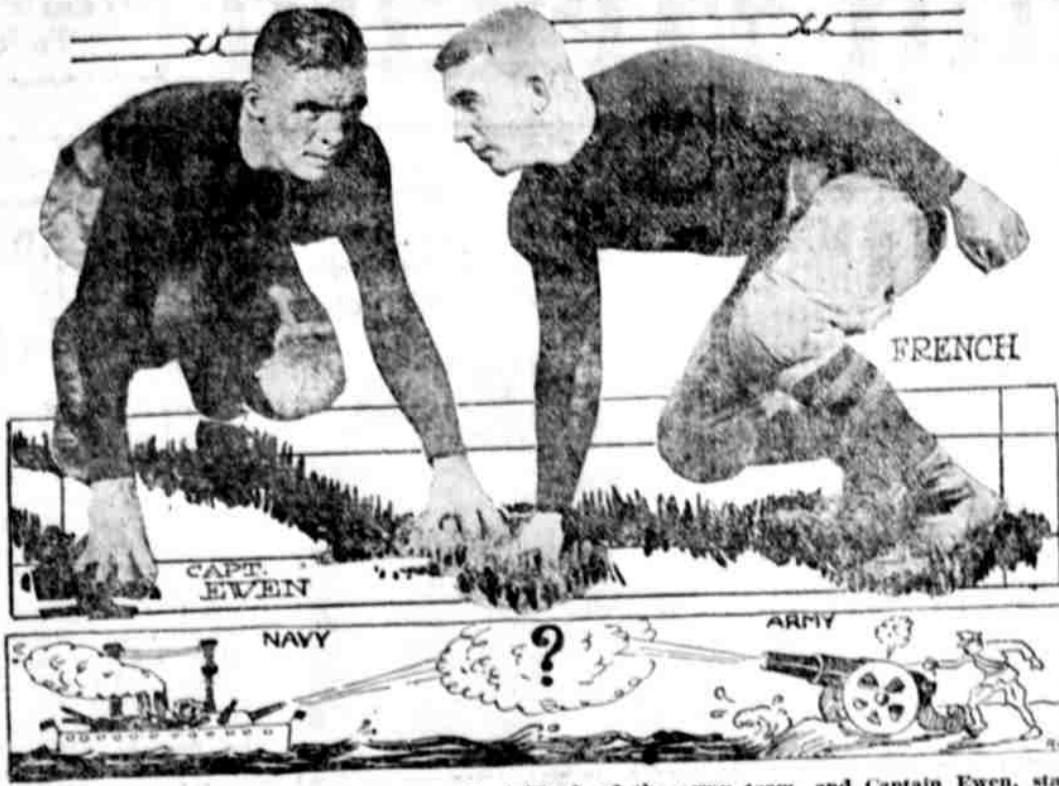


Stars of the Army and Navy Game

Appeal for Urgent Aid to Save Near East Refugees

Copy of a cablegram from Bayard Dodge, manager of the Near East relief work in the Syria-Allepo area, has been received by the local Near East Relief committee from Portland headquarters. It says that Armenian refugees are pouring into Allepo and that the emergency created is very imperative. Severe weather has started, many women and children are homeless and present appropriations must continue throughout the winter.

Roads are jammed with fleeing, unfed half-naked refugees, it is said, and an urgent appeal is made to rush food, medicine and clothing.

There must be a great increase in the present budget, declares Charles Vickery, national chairman, unless America wants to see former allies die in exile for lack of food and clothing. Appeal is made to all parts of Oregon for assistance.

Improved Wrench Is Invention of Local Mechanic

Domenico Forniraseo, proprietor of the Klamath Novelty works, 902 Klamath Ave., has secured a patent on a new wrench, for which he expects to find a ready sale among mechanics.

The wrench is simply constructed. A movable jaw is controlled by a thumb cam, pressure on which allows it to be slid away from the fixed jaw, setting the wrench for any size nut. The jaws can be moved together by a slight pressure of the thumb.

The simplicity of operation, it is expected by the inventor, will appeal to all mechanics and he expects the wrench to become quickly popular.
