Sheep Men Must Readjust Industry

Reduction of wages has started in sheep business and a general curtailment will be necessary, according to Jim Murtha one of the big sheepmen of Gilliam county. "We've been paying \$100 a month and found to be sheep-borders, and this has been cut to \$75 and may go lower," stated Mr. Murtha at the Imperial yesterday.
