

**Malin High School
Dance Proves Big
Success; Nets \$100**

MALIN, Dec. 14.—More than 100 couples helped make the Union high school dance, which was held at the town hall here Saturday evening, a complete success. The program consisted of four songs by the school. One song was sung between the third and fourth dances, two were sung during the sixth dance, one being "Let the Rest of the World Go By" and the other "The Tumble Down Shack in Athlone." The last selection which was sung during the eighth dance was "Beautiful Ohio."

The high school reports that about \$100 were left after all expenses and incidentals were paid. The supper yielded about \$43, the orangeade about \$15, and the rest came from the sale of tickets at the door and at different places in Klamath Falls and Malin.

The proceeds of the dance will be used in buying athletic equipment, specializing in basket ball, paraphernalia. The high school will soon begin action along the line of basket ball.
