MALIN, Dec. 20.—Class work and practice work in elementary journalism as a part of the English course at the Union high school has been

in progress for five weeks. A total of approximately 100 column inches of printed material has been published, or more than five newspaper columns, averaging slightly more than a column per week. This material is gathered and written by the seven students in the two upper classes, each student writing two or more stories each week.

The course is designed to train students in gathering and writing news stories, to add interest in the written work in English, to train students in observation, encourage civic pride and permit boosting of the community. Stories are written by the students, and edited by the instructor.
