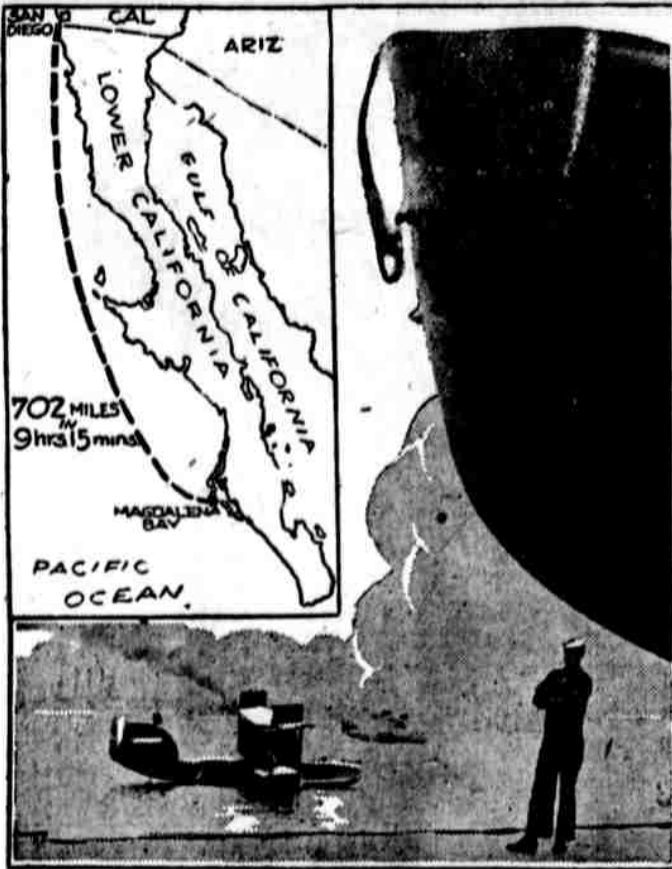


Another Air Record



Uncle Sam hung up a new aviation record—non-stop flight with pilot and five passengers—when the N C-5 flew from San Diego to Magdalena Bay, Lower California, in nine hours and 15 minutes. Distance 702 miles; speed about 72 miles an hour. The N C-5 is a U. S. navy seaplane—a sister of the N C-4 which made the first trans-Atlantic flight. She is shown resting in the water, while on the pier a sailor is standing under the nose of another of the same type. This gives an idea of the great size of these great planes.

ADVISES USE OF ALFALFA BY DAIRYING

OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, Corvallis, Jan. 12.—Why not try selling surplus alfalfa hay through products of a dairy herd? "Alfalfa is selling at a much lower price than for several years," says E. B. Fitts, professor of dairy expansion of O. A. C. "In fact the market is glutted in some districts with no outlet in sight. "A material start was made in dairying in some of the alfalfa growing districts just prior to the war, but with higher prices for hay and a labor shortage there was a stampede to sell the dairy cow and take what seemed like easier money in raising and selling hay. Now with conditions again returning to normal the dairy cow looms on the horizon as the best channel for marketing this important crop. "The alfalfa grower who kept his cows received good prices for hay fed them, and now has a position of van-

tage as he still has a good market for his crops." A good cow yields 60 to 75 pounds butterfat from one ton of alfalfa hay eaten, and in addition releases 1000 pounds skim milk that is valuable as feed for calves, swine and poultry. Marketing the hay in concentrated form of dairy, pork and poultry products saves handling and shipping. It is true conservation Professor Fitts points out. Good cows can now be bought at reasonable figures," he declares, "and alfalfa men should give serious consideration to this opportunity for building up a permanent market for their surplus hay and at the same time add a new industry to their community by engaging in the dairy business. The monthly pay checks will prove a real asset, and the farm will become increasingly fertile." In a statement to the directors, the secretary, said that he realized that he had been overpaid, considering the size of Marysville and the population of the county generally. He was given a vote of confidence by the directors.
